## PASTOR ANTHONY'S RIPPLES

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

We have come to the end of our first full programmatic year as Circle of Faith Parish. The year began with many cottage meetings happening throughout the parish. At each one of those meetings we began by reading from the letter of 1 Peter 2:2-10, which included our theme verse throughout this year:

"...you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." I Peter 2:9

We have spent the last 9 months wrestling with and challenging each other with this text. We also spent this time tackling the question, "Who Are We?" As I look back over these last 9 months, I can see that we have begun forming an identity for ourselves as a parish. We are not just three congregations sharing two pastors. But rather, we are three congregations that have partnered together to proclaim the risen Christ in a new and stronger way in Southern Minnesota! There are already ideas and projects in the works for next year and all of this is because God has been working through YOU to be his hands and feet in the Ceylon, Trimont, and Welcome communities.

Our focus on 1 Peter 2:2-10 is coming to an end with the Bible study on 1 Peter that has just finished up. But our daily devotion and our regular worship and giving never ends. We continue to deepen our relationship with God with prayer, reading of scripture and regular worship (even in the summerJ). One of the ways you can do this is through a new worship time! This summer we will be offering a Wednesday night worship, meal and Bible Study. The worship service will be a simple 30 minute service with Holy Communion. The free meal and Bible study will happen at the same time (eating while we study). Worship begins at 6:00 pm with the meal/study at 6:30 pm. We will be done by 7:30 pm each night. You're certainly welcome to come to both, but if you can only come to worship or only the meal/study that's just fine. Come as you are for either one, or both. This will happen 4 times this summer (June 25, July 9, July 23, and August 6) and each time will be located at Trinity.

Remember, just because our normal program year is coming to an end, the church does not end. Our relationship with God and the work of the Gospel doesn't take the summer off. The leadership of your parish will be working hard this summer to get some of these new projects and ideas turned into realities for this coming fall. One thing that we need your help in doing is coming up with a service project that we can do together on Sunday, September 7<sup>th</sup>. On that day, all 10,000+ ELCA congregations will be going out into their communities to serve their neighbors. What would you like Circle of Faith to do? Talk to me or a council member about your ideas.

God bless you in your summer journeys, travels and adventures! And remember to take a break for God and for yourself!

We were reminded that as the clay jar that holds the treasure of the gospel all we, the church, really need is a book, a towel, a table and a cup. And, we are not alone. God is working in and through us all the time so that the gospel gets proclaimed and lived out.

I thought about our theme, "Who are we?". We are a clay jar so that all will know that the power is not in us but in God. We are a tested, trusting, called, holy and proclaiming clay jar. The people of God with a treasure to share.

Pr. Anthony led devotions, based on I Peter 2:2-10. "Let (allow) yourselves be built into a spiritual house." Ties into our current bible study. Specifically, God calls each of us to be his child, his chosen one. 6:13

- . Synod Assembly June 13-15, 2014.
- . Bible Study on 1 Peter continues through the end of May.
- . Carl Rabbe's summer Ministerial Associate Project will be on the question on, "How did we get here?" 4 evening gatherings, including Holden Evening Prayer, light supper, and presentation/discussion. Held on alternating Wednesday evenings, June 25th, July 9th, July 23th, August 6th. (Moving Men's Garage in August to 8/13.) Need assistance in providing food for those meals, a pianist and one other soloist for helping to leading Holden. Let Pr. Anthony know if you can help.
- . Carl has been synodically authorized by Bishop Jon to serve communion while he is here this summer.
- . Parish Youth Group starting. Taking high school grades 9-12 to Valley Fair in August. Beginning in September, youth group will meet on (2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>) Sunday evenings each month, one night a study, the other a fun event. # "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday

"God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday is an ELCA Churchwide event, held annually on the Sunday after Labor Day, this year on September 7<sup>th</sup>, where the entire ELCA works on service projects of congregation's own choosing. Choosing projects: we will contact Crest, and other congregations who have done this in the past, to come up with ideas. Will decide at June meeting what we will do, and whether we will do this as a Parish or as individual congregations. Have option to order t-shirts to wear (purchased at cost from the ELCA).

## **Trinity Sunday School – 2014-15 concept**

Liz Stahl discussed an idea from the Trinity Sunday School, and the UCC church in town, who currently team up to do VBS together. (VBS will be July 27-31<sup>st</sup> – Sunday through Thursday. Entire parish is invited to participate and help. More info will be coming from Trinity.

Trinity and the Welcome UCC church are currently discussing a joint Sunday School next year. They would move "Sunday School" to Wednesday. They would like to Waverly and St. Peter to join in the discussion, if interested. Will pass on to the Board of Ed at Waverly, and the St. Peter Sunday School teachers for discussion.

Discussion on the merits of a Wednesday evening Christian Education program at sometime in the future. Pros and cons were discussed, brainstorming of ideas shared. This will be discussed again in the future.




